Where are the women CEOs?

The progress of women to the top role in the world's largest publicly listed companies has been slow since the appointment of the first woman CEO of a Fortune 500 company, in 1963. After six decades, there are still only 8% around the world.

Only 8% of CEOs leading some of the worlds' largest publicly listed companies are women.


